

PERSONNELGENERAL PERSONNEL – Blood borne Pathogens Standards

The Regional Office of Education acknowledges possible risk that employees may incur when they handle or participate in procedures that involve blood, body fluid, or other potentially infectious material from a blood borne pathogen. The Regional Superintendent will implement the Occupational and Health Administration (OSHA) standard to eliminate or minimize occupational exposure to potentially infectious materials.

The Regional Superintendent or his/her designee shall prepare and distribute to all employees an Occupational Exposure Control Plan. The plan shall be reviewed and updated at least annually. The plan shall address the following issues:

- exposure determination
- implementation schedule
- procedures for evaluating an exposure incident
- universal precautions
- employees responsible for the implementation of the standards
